Pathways marks 15 years

More than 400 guests attended Pathways Awareness Foundation's 15th anniversary celebration Nov. 3 at the Four Seasons Hotel in Chicago. About \$450,000 was raised for the foundation, which provides information on the value, resources and best practices of early detection and therapy for children with physical movement differences and sensory concerns.

The anniversary marked the presentation of the first Pathways Pioneer award, which was given to Dr. John Sarwark, co-chair of Pathways Medical Round Table, head of pediatric orthopedic surgery at Children's Memorial Hospital and professor of orthopedic surgery at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. He was honored for his ground-breaking research in the field of early detection.

Maggie C. Daley received the 2004 Pathways Inspirational Leader award for her 15 years on the



Nancy and Gideon Searle of Winnetka.

Pathways Medical Round Table and 10 years as president of Pathways Awareness Foundation. Both honorees will continue to serve as spokespersons for the Glenview-based Pathways.

Pathways was established in 1988 by Shirley and Patrick Ryan of Winnetka. Its program is based on the belief that the brain has an infinite capacity to make new pathways and that children can learn proper body movement through physical and speech therapy.
