### **Important Milestone Reminders:**

- If Baby was premature, be sure to adjust all milestones for prematurity.

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* Motor	Not Started	Making Progress	Achieved
While lying on their tummy lifts and holds head up			
Able to move fists from closed to open			
Moves legs and arms off of surface when excited			

Sensory	Not Started	Making Progress	Achieved
While lying on back, visually tracks moving toy from side to side			
Able to calm with rocking, touching, and gentle sounds			
Enjoys a variety of movements

Quiets or smiles in response to sound or voice			
Shows interest in faces			
Makes eye contact			
Cries differently for different needs, e.g. hungry vs. tired			
Coos and smiles

Tongue moves forward and back to suck			
Drinks 2 oz. to 4 oz. of breast milk/formula per feeding

Eyes track together by 3 months

Uses smiles, sounds, or movement to get attention

When hungry will open mouth for breast or bottle			
Drinks 4 oz. to 6 oz. of breast milk/formula per feeding

## **Important Milestone Reminders:**

Uses babbling to get attention			
Makes different kinds of sounds to express feelings			
Begins to giggle or laugh

Moves food from front of mouth to back			
Begins to eat baby safe foods, other than milk - such as pureed or soft solid foods

While lying on their back, transfers toy from one hand to the other			
In simple play imitates others

Investigates shapes, sizes, and textures of toys and surroundings			
Observes environment from a variety of positions – while lying on back or tummy, sitting, crawling, and standing with assistance
